## Fix-a-Failure

<b>Problem in the Articles of Confederation</b>	<b>Where does the Constitution fix the problem? (Article # and section or Amendment #)</b>	<b>What does the Constitution say? (Summarize the solution)</b>
Congress was not able to collect taxes.		
The national government could not enforce laws.		
Each state had one vote in Congress regardless of size or population.		
A unanimous vote was required to change or amend the Articles of Confederation.
